VSO Receives 2024 NACo Award for Veteran Employment Program (VEP)!



The Orange County (OC) Veterans Service Office (VSO) has been recognized with a National Association of Counties (NACo) Achievement Award in the Human Services category for the Veteran Employment Program (VEP). This program helps Veterans and their families transition to civilian life by providing career planning, job readiness training, and placement services. VEP partners with other County agencies, including OC Workforce & Economic Development Division and OC Health Care Agency's OC4Vets, to offer a complete support package, including personalized assessments,

counseling, mental health screenings, and more.

CalVet files for VA Grant to Build Veterans Cemetery at Gypsum Canyon

CalVet has submitted an application and is formally requesting funding from the U.S. Veterans Administration (VA) to build a cemetery at the Gypsum Canyon site.

This step is required, and if approved, the State will receive a grant of up to \$10 million.

Presidential Pardon for Certain Military Convictions

On June 26, 2024, <u>President Biden issued a proclamation</u> granting a full, complete, and unconditional pardon to individuals with court-martial convictions for violations of former Article 125 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice. This applies to convictions between May 31, 1951, and December 26, 2013. To qualify, individuals must not have engaged in conduct listed in the exceptions of the proclamation.

Those who qualify and receive a pardon certificate may be eligible for additional VA benefits earned during their military service. Note that the pardon does not change an individual's character of service. The VA encourages anyone discharged under dishonorable conditions who receives a pardon certificate to apply to their Board of Correction of Military or Naval Records.

A national campaign to recruit veterans and military family members to support our elections

More than 1 million volunteers are needed to run national elections. Poll workers are essential to making elections happen and get to see American democracy in action. Responsibilities include:

- Opening the polls in the morning;
- Checking in voters and issuing ballots; •
- Maintaining the chain of custody of ballots, voting equipment and supplies; •
- Reconciling the number of voters checked in with the number of ballots cast • at their location; among other duties.

Veterans can earn around \$200 per day by serving as county poll workers. Over 50% of counties report a shortage of poll workers during elections.
