
Age and Gender




The veteran population in Orange County shows a higher percentage of White (63.7%) and Asian (10.7%) veterans compared to California overall.

Orange County has fewer Black or African American (3.7%) and Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander veterans (0.0%) compared to California.

In **Orange County** there are slightly less veterans who identify as Hispanic or Latino compared to **California**. Conversely, there is a higher percentage of veterans who identify as White, not Hispanic or Latino, in **Orange County**.

(Assessment following the California Master Plan on Aging five goals and strategies)

Aim: To determine the needs of older adults within OC

Survey Details:

- Online, in-person and phone surveys from Sept 2023 through Jan 2024
- Outreach efforts:
 - Community events
 - Senior centers
 - Nursing homes
 - Unhoused individuals
 - Incarcerated individuals
- Convenience Sampling of those aged 55 and older
- 30 to 60 min to complete the survey
- Some participants received incentives for their time
- 451 veterans responded from Orange County









Most veterans in Orange County report having some college or higher education.




Less veterans obtain jobs upon leaving the military in **Orange County** compared to Los Angeles and San Diego counties.

Employment Upon Leaving the Military







What is your employment status?




Housing











Over the past 12 months, how much time did you spend as a patient in hospital*









Slightly over half of Orange County veterans received their health care from Veterans Affairs and have used VHA less frequently compared to Los Angeles and San Diego counties in the past year.

Veterans Health Administration Usage in the Past Year








Majority of veterans are satisfied with their services with the highest dissatisfaction, approximately 3 out of 20, with Veterans Affairs and Tricare Provider.

Satisfaction with Healthcare Services








Most veterans 55 years and older reported having Medicare and/or Private insurance coverage.











Most veterans 55 years and older reported being comfortable managing their own health and most ask questions/visit their doctor or service provider in person to find information about healthcare resources.





Suicide Risk





What contributes to your mental or behavioral health issues? (select all that apply)*




Social Connectedness

Social Connectedness Ratings










Employment is a highly utilized service, especially for those who return from the service.

Physical health services are a top concern and requested service.



Approximately 2 out of every 10 veterans 55 years or older reported lack of information about where to get help which prevents them from receiving healthcare services.


Barriers to Receiving Healthcare Services (select all that apply)





Overall OC Data Highlights

1. Education

Most veterans have some college or more in OC.

2. Employment

- Ensure transition into jobs based on the training and degrees received.
- Address the challenge of transitioning into a job after service.
- Few veterans (5%) 55 and older report looking for a job in OC.

3. Housing

- Although most have a place to return to, 3 out of 20 reported not having a place to go after service.
- 13 out of 20 veterans 55 years and older reporting owning their own home or condo.

Overall OC Data Highlights

4. Health

- Those reporting physical health symptoms, approximately 4 out of 10, are lower than other counties.
- Older adult veterans report cost of living/economic security as their top health issue contributor.

5. Healthcare

 Most veterans in OC report having healthcare and utilize VHA less than other counties.

6. Mental Health

- Mental health concerns are less prominent compared to other counties, although 1 in 4 are still at risk for suicide.
- The top contributors to mental health in older adult veterans was political climate and economic insecurity.

Overall OC Data Highlights

7. Social Connectedness

• Even though older adult veterans report connecting with family and friends, 9 out of 20 veterans report feeling disconnected and an internal sense of isolation.

8. Service Use, Satisfaction and Needs

- Employment services are highly utilized though this service has the highest rate of neutral or dissatisfaction.
- Physical health services are the top additional service requested by the population.
